Alienating behavior toward their child by either or both parents involved in high-conflict divorces appears to be significantly on the rise. Perhaps the divorce contretemps that matrimonial attorneys customarily see have been exacerbated by the economic crisis our nation and state are experiencing or perhaps we are simply more aware of such behaviors. In any event, it is imperative that we take prompt and effective action to identify and seek corrective measures to prevent harm to the child and to heal the relationship between the child and both parents. Parent coordination and reunification therapy, although they are entirely different remedies, are two very important tools available to matrimonial attorneys and courts to identify the issues, educate the parties, monitor the parenting and progress, advise the parties and mediate such disputes. On January 5, 2011, a comprehensive set of amendments to the New Jersey Construction Lien Law, Title 2A:44A-1 through 38, were signed into law by Governor Chris Christie. It has been 16 years since the New Jersey Construction Lien Law has been revised. The amendments implemented proposed changes recommended by the New Jersey Law Revision Commission report of 2009, which attempted to respond to, clarify and resolve problems with the Lien Law that were encountered by the construction industry and addressed by reported court decisions since the 1994 adoption of the Construction Lien Law.
