What Types of Experts Are Most Persuasive

 Experts Who are Knowledgeable in The Specific Technology/Science

Independent Experts (Consider Academics)

 Experts Who are Able To Fully Support Their Opinions

Expert Who Do Not Overreach on Their Opinions



How to Present Expert Testimony Most Effectively

- Standard Examination in Each Party's Case
- Witness Statements And Live Cross-Examination

- Hot Tubbing
- Examining Experts Separately, But by Topic
- Questioning By Arbitrator(s)



How to Avoid Wasting Time And Money

- Consider Arbitrator(s) Background
- Open Dialog Early So Experts Are Engaged On Topics That Will Aid The Arbitrator(s)
- Consider:
 - a. Written Background Report
 - b. Joint Expert Tutorial
 - c. Agreement on Journal or Other Technical Articles
- Provide an Opportunity For Arbitrator(s) To Ask Questions
- Tribunal Appointed Expert(s)



Avoiding Common Pitfalls

- Not Considering How To Jointly Address
 - i. Experts
 - Establish Technical Issues And Background
- Focusing Experts On Legal Issues
